
What Else Can I Do?

After you've told everyone you know about DIY Impeachment, you can also send additional copies of the memorial to other members of the House of Representatives, starting with your own representative in the House. Find out who your representative is at: http://www.house.gov/ Here's what to do:

1. Print out the documents in this pdf (two cover letters, and two petitions)



3. OPTIONAL: According to the chief parliamentarian in the U.S. House of Representatives and his deputy, these memorials do not need to be notarized. If you'd rather be on the safe side, however, there are many local banks or workplaces that will notarize them at no cost. There are also notaries in every law office. IMPORTANT: If you decide to get the petitions notarized, wait to sign and date them until you are in the presence of the notary. You can find a notary at: http://www.notaryrotary.com/agent/search.asp

However, do not let the inconvenience of notarizing the memorials stop you from sending them. If you are unlikely to go to this effort, or if you do not have a bank account and are unwilling to pay to have them notarized (usually a very small fee if not free at many businesses), then simply sign it and send it in. Notarization is probably not necessary, and regardless, your document will help create political pressure.

- 4. If you've decided against getting the document notarized, then sign and date the "Signature" line of the two petitions that have the bit about notarization on them.
- 5. Address one envelope with the name and address of your representative, and the other with the Impeach for Peace address supplied on the cover letter.
- 6. Write your return address on the two envelopes and put stamps on them.
- 7. Place the memorials and cover letters in the appropriately addressed envelopes.
- 8. Mail them.
- 9. Email all your friends about this!
- 10. Celebrate as you watch Bush impeached!
